Rich Park: Me and Bod put this together with glue and scissors in 1999, never thought it'd be still going. The inspiration was an Interkosmos badge I picked up in

Berlin (right). When I did the original photocopy, yes photocopy, I simply took a sticky star from a wall planner and put it on the edge of the circle. The star trails were literally slivers of paper I cut out. Bod created the disc and the typeface with the curvy zoom.



So there you go: Republica's crest is 21 years old and inspired by a Soviet space program for sending cosmonauts out of this world!

#### FC Gascoigne 2 – 2 Republica Leeds Sunday Alliance League Div. 1, 21st Sept. 2014

Despite having just one shot on target, an own goal and Patrick Newton strike was enough for Republica men to snatch a draw in Garforth against a strong Gascgoine side. The hosts were dominant in the first half as the Republica defence faced wave after wave of attack. A mixture of wayward finishing and some excellent saves from Man of the Match Colm Fitzpatrick meant we went into half-time trailing by only one goal to nil. It could have been six.

The second half started more brightly for the away side with some early pressure in the Gascoigne half. And the pressure told as Cedric turned his man on the edge of the box and delivered a cross which the defender turned in to his own net, much to the


